



What is your gender identity?




How often do you use the Ridge to Rivers Trail System?







Historically, Ridge to Rivers has established seasonal closures for some trails due to muddy conditions.


Would you support the implementation of seasonal closures at other trail locations to help protect the trail system during the winter/wet season?



Trail Management Feedback:




Key takeaways and our response:

- People appreciate the trail condition reports; trail crews will continue to post regular updates on the Facebook page, website, and interactive map.
- Following many requests for trail loop recommendations, the trail crew is putting together various suggestions for both hikers and bikers throughout the foothills trail system.
- There were requests for a QR code linking to the interactive map to be available at trailheads – these have now been installed.
- People want to know peak use times and how to beat the crowds on popular trails.



Do you use accessible trails throughout the Ridge to Rivers system?





Feedback and Next Steps:

- There are lots of requests for text message alerts about trail conditions. We are now making this happen! Users can now opt into occasional texts about trail conditions, closures, or urgent trail information.
 - 1. Download RainoutLine from the app store
 - 2. Search for Boise Parks and Recreation
 - 3. Find Ridge to Rivers Trail Condition Report
 - 4. Click Bell and Star to receive notifications, allow notifications on your device
- Users continue to like the separation of uses; there is a call for community education about trail etiquette across all user groups.
- People love hitting the trails with their pups but need to be better about cleaning up after them.
- There is a shared appreciation for the trails, how well they're maintained, and how grateful people are for the trail crew members.
